Rector's Letter

Dear Friends,

Who would you describe as the most truthful person that you know? Whose words would you say that you truly believe?



In a world where there are many untrustworthy voices, knowing that there are honest people in our lives is highly important to us. It is good to know that from certain people, words said are most often accurate and truthful. Whilst even those of greatest integrity cannot be perfectly true all of the time, over time particular people gain our consideration of trustworthiness and for them we can be very thankful.

Our "Joy to the World' Christmas Tree Festival will focus upon words from Scripture of our need for a Saviour, his birth, life, death and resurrection and the hope of what is to come. The trees will be decorated to help us consider words fulfilled and to be completed. Scripture points to a time and the words of the hymn 'Joy to the World' will become realised in that "He rules the world with truth and grace, and makes the nations prove the glories of his righteousness and wonders of his love." 

According to Habitat for Humanity, the housing situation in Romania is one of the most difficult in the EU where 5.5 million people are in need of renovating their homes, over 40% of the population is living in overcrowded conditions (EU average is 16.8%) and 42.5% of the population live in a house without a bath or toilet. Significant funds have to be raised to enable to team to go and participate in this very worthwhile trip, therefore please do keep an eye out for fundraisers in the new year. 




AYAC MINI REDSIDENTIAL

There will be lots for all to enjoy over




the course of the weekend. All young people from our parish and their friends are welcome and further details are available from Malcolm.


ALPHA


